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## Year 7 Literacy & Numeracy Catch-up Premium 2019-20

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### **Total Allocated funding: £11,777.00**

Catch up premium is additional funding given to schools to support pupils who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or mathematics at the end of KS2. Each school is allocated funding based on the amount of funding they received in the previous year. It is up to schools to decide how to use the funding most effectively to support students who have not reached the expected standard.

At The Telford Priory School, we use a range of measures including previous teacher assessment data from Primary Schools, Question Level Analysis, and baseline assessments. This allows us to identify areas that require more support for Year 7s who have not reached their expected standard in key stage 2. After we have identified students' additional needs, we put in place the support required to help students achieve their expected standard. We use a variety of methods, based on research of effective practice carried out by the Education Endowment Foundation.

### **Access criteria**

To access catch up provision, year 7s must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- KS2 Transition information highlights one or more areas of need.
- Reading test identifies specific aspects of literacy that require intervention.
- Identified SEND needs.
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### **Priorities for spending**

The school evaluated the priorities for spending in relation to supporting students to catch up with their curriculum. The money has been spent as follows. These strategies/ appointments/ staffing structures are evaluated half termly and amendments made to the remits/ deployment.
